

Medical Oncology fellowship at Tata Medical Center, Kolkata

The post will be supervised by consultants working in the department of medical oncology.

Qualifications:

Essential: MD/DNB in General Medicine or any allied specialities

Job description in brief:

1. To look after in-patients and out patients who are under the treatment of Medical Oncology.
2. To attend to emergency patients under Medical Oncology who present to Emergency during day time.
3. To do clinical rounds daily in the in-patient along with consultants of the Medical Oncology team.
4. To understand the care needs of patients who are being discharged home and help set-up out-patient treatment plan post discharge.
5. To communicate effectively with patients and family members.
6. To work and interface with multidisciplinary teams and from various other specialities as Surgical Oncology, Paediatric Oncology, Radiation Oncology, Palliative Medicine and other specialities.
7. To engage in audit and research activities of the department.
8. To do night calls on a shared rota (around once a week or less) for palliative medicine and allied specialities.
